### Dual Enrollment



### \$15 million

#### Dual enrollment reimbursement

- For any student who qualifies for free or reduced lunch & has at least a 2.5 GPA
- Up to \$50 per student per credit hour
- Must receive A, B, or C in course to qualify
- Maximum of \$300 per student per year for 9<sup>th</sup>/10<sup>th</sup> graders
- Maximum of \$600 per student per year for 11<sup>th</sup>/12<sup>th</sup> graders

### Course requirements

#### Courses must meet one of the following requirements:

- Fulfills a lower division gen ed credit at a state university or community college
- Is a CTE course that is required for a certificate, credential or license

# Dual Enrollment Providers (institutions that grant the college credit)

#### **Providers will:**

- Enroll students and waive up to \$50 per credit hour in applicable courses
- Ensure that students meet requirements for free or reduced lunch
- Submit report to ADE for direct reimbursement

### High Schools

#### High Schools will:

- Develop data sharing and IGAs to ensure students are eligible for free or reduced lunch
- Sign up students for courses and ensure they receive information

# Reporting to ADE (by providers)

#### In January & June

- Student IDs and grade levels
- Qualifying course & program
- # of credit hours
- Cost per credit hour that was waived

## Frequently Asked Questions

- What is required to consider a course dual enrollment for this funding? Does concurrent enrollment count?
  - In order to qualify, a dual enrollment course must be taken at the high school or CTED and
  - Must qualify the student for both high school and college credit.

# Frequently Asked Questions

- For an incoming freshman, is the GPA requirement waived?
  - No, freshmen without a high school GPA will not be included in this funding
- How can CTEDs get access to free and reduced lunch status of students when they enroll in dual enrollment courses?

### Frequently Asked Questions

- How can CTEDs get access to free and reduced lunch status of students when they enroll in dual enrollment courses?
  - The easiest way to do this without extra work for students will be to add a statement and box to the dual enrollment form
  - Get recommended language from legal that basically says: I am applying for a fee waiver and give permission for my high school \_\_\_\_\_\_ to verify my free/reduced lunch eligibility status.
